The Company has received a notice proposing the candidature of Shri Pushp Kumar Joshi for the office of Director in terms of Section 160 of the Companies Act, 1956.

None of the Directors except Shri Pushp Kumar Joshi / Key Managerial Personnel of the Company / their relatives are, in any way, concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the Ordinary Resolution set out at Item No. 5 of the Notice

ITEM No 6 & 7

Section 180(1)(c) of the Companies Act, 2013 provides that the Board of Directors of the Company shall only with the consent of the members by a Special Resolution, borrow money where the money to be borrowed, together with the money already borrowed by the Company will exceed aggregate to its paid-up share capital and free reserves, apart from temporary course of business.

Further, as per the provisions of Section 180(1)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013, the mortgage or charge on all or any of the moveable and/or immoveable properties of the Company may be deemed as disposal of the whole or substantially the whole of the undertaking of the Company, hence requires the approval from the members of the Company by way of Special Resolution.

IMPACT OF PROVISIONS OF NEW COMPANIES ACT, 2013

Due to notification of most of the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, your Company needs to comply with the following

- 1) Appointment of at least two independent directors
- 2) Formation of Audit Committee
- 3) Formation of Nomination and Remuneration Committee
- 4) Formation of Corporate Social Responsibility Committee for compliance of provisions of Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013.

However, through various clarification circulars issued by the Ministry of corporate Affairs, one year time frame has been given to comply with the above from the date of notification of the provisions, i.e., 1st April, 2014. In the meantime, your Board of Directors is making its best efforts to comply with the same within a reasonable time.

BUSINESS & OPERATIONS

A) Project Highlights

a) Hyderabad -

- Operating total 18 CNG stations. (1 Mother Station, 14 Retail Outlets and 3 APSRTC Depots)
- Approx. 18,000 vehicles are running on CNG. (Buses, Autos and Cars)
- Cumulative 113 KMs of MDPE pipeline laid enabling fronts for 25,000 PNG-Domestic connections.
- As on 31st March, 2014, 443 no's PNG-Domestic connections, 2 Industrial and 4 commercial connections are operational.
- Cumulative 33.546 Kms of Steel pipeline laid (16" and 4").

b) Vijayawada -

- 1 Mother Station and 7 Daughter Booster Stations are in operation.
- 23.75 KMs of MDPE pipeline laid.
- Cumulative 29.53 Kms of Steel pipeline laid (12" and 4").
- Approx. 7700 vehicles are running on CNG (Buses, Autos and Cars).
- As on 31st March, 2014, 109 no's PNG-Domestic connections, 3 commercial connections are operational.

c) Kakinada -

- 1 Mother Station and 2 Daughter Booster Stations (1 at Kakinada and 1 at Rajahmundary) are in operation.
- Approx. 930 vehicles are running on CNG. (Autos and Cars)
- 129 KMs of MDPE pipeline laid.
- As on 31st March, 2014, 1549 no's PNG-Domestic and 30 commercial connections are operational.
- Cumulative 32 Kms of Steel pipeline laid (10" and 4").

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B) Business Activities

During the year the Company received 1,00,000 SCMD of APM Gas. Company was receiving R-LNG to the tune of 12,500 SCMD through swap arrangement against GAIL's KG D6 allocation meant for their LPG plant. However w.e.f 4th June 2013, company stopped receiving R-LNG.

The Company did not receive any gas out of the firm and fall-back allocation from KG D6 field. As a result, the size of operations was limited to the said extent of APM and to some extent permissible overdrawals.

Given below is the status of business line wise:

a) CNG

During the FY 2013-14, your company operated 18 CNG stations in Hyderabad (1 Mother Station, 14 Retail Outlets and 3 APSRTC depots), 8 CNG stations in Vijayawada (1 Mother Station, 4 Retail outlets and 3 APSRTC Depots) and 3 CNG stations in Kakinada (1 Mother station and 2 Retail Outlets). CNG as an alternate fuel concept has gained acceptance gradually with over 26,700 vehicles (autos, cars and buses) operating to CNG.

The sales volumes during 2013-14 in Hyderabad, Vijayawada, Kakinada and Rajahmundry (including APSRTC -24090 Kgs/day) touched an average of 67,319 kgs/day. The Average sale of CNG was 67,444 Kgs/day during 2012-13. Reasons for drop in CNG sales was non availability of R-LNG post 4th June 2013 and "Samakhya Andhra Strike" at Vijayawada from 12th August 2013 to 10th Oct 2013. During this period, there was no off-take of CNG by APSRTC at Vijayawada.

In Vijayawada, APSRTC is operating 330 buses on CNG, whereas in Hyderabad 150 RTC buses are running on CNG. During the year, the CNG Sales to APSRTC is Rs.36.66 crore. For the year 2012-13 the sales to APSRTC was Rs.35.95 crores.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. BACKGROUND

BGL was promoted as a joint venture company between Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited ('HPCL'), and GAIL (India) Limited ('GAIL') to carry on all or any businesses of storage, supply, sale, distribution and marketing of CNG and Auto LPG as fuel for vehicles, Piped Natural Gas for domestic/commercial/industrial purposes in the State of Andhra Pradesh.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies are as follows:

2.1 Accounting Conventions

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). GAAP comprises mandatory accounting standards as prescribed by the Companies Accounting Standards Rules 2006, the Companies Act 1956 & the Companies Act 2013 (to the extent applicable). The accounting policies applied by the company are consistent with those used in previous year., Accounting Standards and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The Company has prepared and presented financial statements in Revised Schedule VI. The adoption of revised Schedule VI does not impact recognition and measurement principles followed for preparation of the financial statements. However it has significant impact on presentation and disclosures made in the financial statements. The company has also reclassified the previous year figures in accordance with the requirements applicable in the current year

2.2 Use of Estimates

The preparations of the financial statements requires estimates and assumptions which affect the reported amount of assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses of the reporting period. The difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known or materialized.

2.3 Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at historical cost on consistent basis and are net of refundable taxes and levies wherever applicable. All costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets till commissioning of such assets are capitalized. In the case of commissioned assets where final payment to the contractor is pending, capitalization is made on provisional basis, subject to necessary adjustment in cost and depreciation in the year of settlement.

2.4 Intangible Assets

Cost of Software directly identified with hardware is capitalized along with the cost of hardware. Application software is capitalized as Intangible Asset.

Cost of licenses and right to use, including sharing with other entities, which are expected to provide future enduring economic benefits are capitalized as intangible assets.



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2.5 Capital Work in Progress

The capital work in progress includes material in transit / value of materials / equipment etc. received at site for use in the projects.

All revenue expenditure incurred during the year, which is attributable to acquisition / construction of fixed assets/projects, is capitalized at the time of commissioning of such assets.

2.6 Borrowing cost

Borrowing cost of funds specially borrowed for the purpose of obtaining qualifying assets and eligible for capitalization along with cost of assets, is capitalized up to the date when the asset is ready for use.

2.7 Depreciation

Depreciation on Fixed Assets is provided on straight line method, at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956. Depreciation is charged pro rata basis.

Cost of leasehold land not exceeding 99 years is amortized over the lease period.

No depreciation is being charged on ROU being perpetual in nature.

Cost of licenses is amortized over the useful life or license period whichever is less.

All assets costing up to Rs. 5,000/- are fully depreciated in the year of capitalization.

Application software capitalized as Intangible Asset is normally amortized over a period of four years or over its useful life before it becomes obsolete, whichever is earlier.

2.8 Inventories

Finished products are valued at cost or at net realizable value, whichever is lower. For CNG, cost is calculated at selling price less VAT, Trade Margin. Finished goods include excise duty wherever applicable.

Raw Materials are valued at cost or net realizable value whichever is lower.

Stores / spares are valued at cost or net realizable value whichever is lower.

Machinery spares which can be used only in connection with an item of fixed asset and their use is expected to be irregular are capitalized with the cost of that fixed asset and are depreciated fully over the remaining useful life of that asset.

2.9 Foreign Currency Transactions

Transactions in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing on the transaction date.

Monetary items (such as Cash, Receivables, Loans, Payable etc.) denominated in foreign currencies, outstanding at the year end, are translated at exchange rates prevailing at year end.

Non Monetary items (such as Investments, Fixed Assets etc.) denominated in foreign currencies are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction(s).

Any gain or loss arising on account of exchange difference either on settlement of on translation is accounted for in the Statement of Profit & Loss.



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2.10 Sale of Products

Sales are net of discount, include applicable excise duty, surcharge and other elements which are allowed to be recovered as part of the price but excludes sales tax.

2.11 Retirement Benefits

The manpower of the Company includes deputationists from GAIL and HPCL on fulltime basis. All employee benefits in case of deputationists, deputed by parent company are accounted based on debit notes raised by their parent company. The Company has not formulated any policy for Retirement benefits to its BGL employees. Pending formulation of policy on retirement benefits, The Company has provided for Gratuity liability and Leave encashment, based on actuarial valuation as per applicable accounting standard.

2.13 Taxes on Income

Current Tax represents the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income for the period. Deferred Tax Asset / Liability resulting from timing difference between book and taxable profit is accounted for considering the tax rate and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted on the balance sheet date and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred Tax Asset, if any is recognized and carried forward only to the extent that there is virtual certainty that the asset will be realized in future.

2.14 Impairment of Assets

At each balance sheet date an assessment is made of whether there is any indication of impairment of assets. An impairment loss is recognized whenever the carrying amount of assets of cash generating units (CGU) exceeds their recoverable amount. After impairment of the assets, if any, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the asset on SLM over its remaining useful life.

2.15 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities, Contingent Assets & Commitments

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is present obligation as a result of past events and it is capable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

Contingent Liabilities in respect of show cause notices are considered only when converted into demands. Contingent liabilities exceeding Rs.1 Lakh in each case are disclosed by way of notes to accounts.

Estimated amount of commitments and contracts remaining to be executed on capital accounts are disclosed in each case above Rs.1 Lakh.

2.16 General

- a. Prepaid expenses and prior period expenses / income upto Rs.1 Lakh in each case are charged to relevant heads of account of the current year.
- b. Liquidated Damages / Price Reduction Schedule, if any are accounted for as and when recovery is affected and the matter is considered settled by the Management.
- c. Insurance claims are accounted for on the basis of claims admitted/settled by the insurers.

3.1 Contingent Liabilities & Commitments:

Contingent Liabilities -

Bank Guarantees issued to PNGRB amounting to Rs. 15,50,00,000/- (Previous Year: Rs 15,51,00,000). Letter of Credit issued to GAIL (India) Ltd. and RGTIL amounting to Rs 5,68,53,277/- (Previous Year: Rs 7.56,40,378).

Contingent Liabilities in respect of show cause notices from excise authorities are considered only when converted into demands, which is Rs 37,76,758 (Previous Year: Rs 42,76,758).

In respect of income tax assessment dues of Rs Nil (Previous Year: Rs 1,63,10,777), the company has received the order dated 10th March 2014 from Income tax Appellate Tribunal, Hyderabad Bench 'A', Hyderabad in favour of BGL. Non - supply of Gas to APSRTC Rs 1,24,74,997 (Previous Year: Rs 1,24,74,997).

Commitments -

The company is required to complete minimum residential connections for piped gas under the terms of contract awarded by PNGRB. Failing to complete the minimum number of connections would make the Company liable for penal consequences, against which the company has submitted bank guarantees to PNGRB and other authorities. The company has received notices from PNGRB for delays in minimum installations at various locations. The penal charges for not completing minimum number of connections as set out in the authorization, cannot be measured at this stage and also the Company has represented the matter to the concerned authorities as the delay is on account of various factors, most of them are beyond the control of the company. The management is confident of getting time limit extended and consequent relief in the matter.



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However in respect of City Gas Distribution activities in Kakinada, PNGRB on 22nd May, 2013, issued a letter to Canara Bank for invocation of the PBG and claimed Rs.1.33 Crs. for non-achievement of milestones by BGL as set out in the authorization. Meanwhile a Writ Petition dated 25th May 2013 was filed by BGL on 27th May 2013 against PNGRB in the High Court of Andhra Pradesh. The interim stay was confirmed and order dated 28th May 2013 was passed by Hon'ble High Court of AP. The interim stay continues as on date.

3.7 Employee Benefits

- a. Defined Contribution Plan The Company pays fixed contribution to Provident Fund at predetermined rates. The contribution to the fund for the period is recognized as expense and is charged to the Profit & Loss A/c.
- b. Defined Benefit Plan The Company has not formulated any policy for Retirement benefits to its BGL employees. Pending formulation of policy on retirement benefits and encashment of earned leave, The Company has provided for encashment of earned leave for an amount of Rs 6,53,791 during the year (Previous Year: Rs 5,50,000) and Gratuity liability for an amount of Rs (80,875) during the year (Previous Year: Rs. 4,80,629) based on actuarial valuation.

3.8 Segment Reporting

The company is engaged in the business of gaseous fuel. This being a single segment no separate figures are given.

There are no geographical segments for reporting purpose.

3.9 Share capital

In line with the Memorandum of understanding, APIIC would be contributing 5% to the equity in the form of cash or land. With this objective APIIC has already allotted land at three places in the cities of Hyderabad, Vijayawada and Kakinada. Total amount of land allotted from APIIC is Rs. 4,51,96,880 (Rs.20,00,000 paid upfront fees) out of which Rs. 4,07,96,880 has been shown as "Advance against Equity" due to pending of procedural formalities, balance of Rs 24,00,000 as payable to APIIC.

Freehold Land amounting to Rs. 3,74,48,480/- and Leasehold Land at Vijayawada amounting to Rs.77,48,400 allotted by APIIC is shown under "Fixed Assets – Gross Block"

Equity shares of the Company have a par value of Rs.10 per share. Each holder of equity share is entitled to one vote per share. In the event of liquidation of the Company the holder of equity shares will be entitled to receive remaining assets (if any) after distribution of all preferential accounts. The distribution will be in pro-rata basis to the equity shares held by the shareholder.

Apart from the rights, restrictions and preferences prescribed by the Companies Act 1956 and the Articles of Association of the company the Share holders' agreement also elaborately deal with the above. The reader is requested to refer to the respective documents for details. In brief the above referred documents provide for restrictions:

On transfer of shares to outsiders
On transfer of shares to the existing shareholders
For issue fresh equity or transfer of shares to outsiders
Appointment of directors etc.



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3.10 Insurance Claim

At company's mother station in Vijayawada, there was a theft of material amounting to Rs.6, 41,196. The company has filed insurance claim for the same. The Company on a conservative basis has charged this loss to Profit and Loss for the year as at 31st March, 2014. The insurance company has not acknowledged the insurance claim.

3.11 Secured Loans

The Company has availed Term Loans and non-fund based limits from consortium of bankers, secured by way of a first *pari-passu* charge on all movable assets, finished goods, work in progress, raw materials and book debts.

Rate of Interest Payable is revised to 11.20% from 10.00% with effect from 27.06.2013

Terms of Repayment:

The Facility will be disbursed in 6 separate Tranches, each Tranche will be made available in each Availability Period commencing from 2010-2012 and ending in 2015 – 2017. The disbursement by the lender will be in the proportion to the funds deployed by the Company/ Promoters by way of Equity so as to ensure that the debt to equity ratio is 70:30

The Company shall repay the Loan disbursed under each Tranche of the facility to the respective Lenders in 24 equal quarterly installments after a moratorium of 36 months after the Initial Drawdown Date from a Tranche.

- 3.16 Management has made an assessment on the impairment of assets and observed that there are no assets whose value got impaired.
- 3.17 During the year interest on term loan / bridge loan amounting to Rs. 11,06,91,878/- has been apportioned to Fixed Assets & Capital Work in Progress.
- **3.18** Figures have been rounded off to nearest rupee.
- 3.19 Previous year figures have been regrouped and / or rearranged wherever necessary to confirm with current year groupings.

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- 3.20 The company has been awarded authorization for city gas distribution at various locations in Andhra Pradesh. The project work at these locations is in progress as at 31st March, 2014. During the year the company carried out a detailed review of expenditures and materials lying in CWIP account, pending completion and capitalization, and identified certain surplus stores, spares and equipments valued at Rs.43,97,16,333. The surplus stores, spares and equipments are removed from CWIP and transferred to stores and spares inventory at the year end. The surplus items transferred to inventory have been valued based on cost / estimated realisable value whichever is lower and the total value worked out to Rs. 37,58,59,776. The difference of Rs. 6,38,56,557/- is reversed and charged to profit and loss.
- 3.21 The Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulatory Board (PNGRB) vide its order dated 10th May, 2013, fixed the KG Basin transportation charges. To give effect to the said order GAIL issued credit note for excess transportation charges recovered from the company in the earlier years. The tariff was revised with effect from November 2008. As these credit notes were not available before the approval of annual accounts for the FY 2012-13 by the Board the same could not be accounted in that year. However these credit note amounts were considered for the purpose of filing of Income Tax return for FY 2012-13. Therefore during the year the Company has accounted the excess recovery of earlier years i.e. the period between the year 2008 and 31st March 2013 amounting to Rs. 13,82,81,632. Being exceptional in nature this is included in the financial statements for current year under Exceptional items.

The credit notes pertaining to current financial year amounting to Rs. 30,70,424 has been adjusted in the purchase cost of natural gas.
